COMMUNICABLE DISEASES prevail in tropical and subtropical conditions and affect more than one billion people living in poverty, costing developing economies billions of dollars every year.

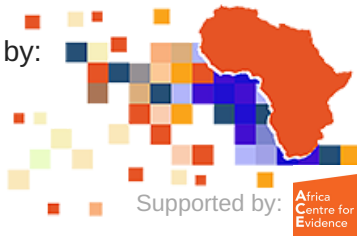
